Patient presentation:

45 years, Female, Negative family history

A suspicious segmental micro-calcification found in left breast screening mammogram which was vacuum-biopsied, LCIS was reported initially and proved with pathology review without any invasion. The whole left breast was involved by suspicious lesions on MRI , there was also a suspicious site in right breast.

Question: Is surgery recommended? Which type of surgery seems more suitable (Skin-sparing mastectomy, Nipple-sparing mastectomy, total mastectomy)

Recommended tests:-Target ultrasound and if needle, core needle biopsy of right breast lesion

Recommended plan: skin-sparing mastectomy for left breast. Right breast should be evaluated more, if involved by LCIS mastectomy can be recommended.
