Patient presentation:

77 years/ Family history –

- History of colon cancer (2006) treated by surgery and chemotherapy.
- Right breast cancer (2010): invasive ductal carcinoma, ER –, PR –, HER2 +, underwent surgery, chemotherapy and radiotherapy followed by Tamoxifen.
- During follow up visits an axillary lymph node was found which contained metastatic carcinoma in fine needle aspiration: specimen considered as local recurrence and treated with Letrozole and Herceptin: Finally resulted in clinical node resolution.
- She has some pathologically proven bone metastasis in her sacroiliac joint.

Question: What should we do for the axilla?

Recommended tests: new axillary ultrasound

Recommended plan: Based on the ultrasound result, if positive node detected, limited surgery followed by radiotherapy is recommended
