**Patient Presentation:**

-A 52 year old female diagnosed with breast cancer two years ago and underwent BSC+SLNB(T2N0, Triple negative) followed by adjuvant chemoRT.

-She presented with dyspnea this year.

-Thoracic CT scan: multiple perihilar and pulmonary nodules.

-PET scan: Pulmonary lesions, hilar LAP.

-Biopsy of lung lesion and IHC: Either primary NSCLC or metastases from breast cancer.

-Brain MRI : Single lesion in occipital lobe.

**Question:** Plan?

**Recommended Plan:** Imaging and pathology review are more in favor of metastasis. Consult with neurosurgeons-to evaluate brain lesion resectability- and brain RT is recommended.
