- -A 52 year old female diagnosed with breast cancer two years ago and underwent BSC+SLNB(T2N0,Triple negative)followed by adjuvant chemoRT.

- -Thoracic CT scan: multiple perihilar and pulmonary nodules.
- -PET scan: Pulmonary lesions, hilar LAP.

Recommended Plan: Imaging and pathology review are more in favor of metastasis. Consult with neurosurgeons-to evaluate brain lesion resectablity- and brain RT is recommended.
