**Patient Presentation:**

- A 36 year old female presented with right breast mass. In her physical examination there was a huge ulcerated mass (10 cm) in LIQ of right breast with chest wall involvement, and right huge axillary lymph node.

-Breast US: Multiple masses in right breast ( B4), a mass in LIQ(B5).

-CNB: IDC, G2, ER+, PR+, Her2 -, Ki67 70%.

-Metastatic work up: Tumor invasion to mediastinum, multiple lung metastases.

-She was referred to oncologist and referred 6 sessions of chemotherapy (TAC).

-Post-chemo physical examination: Right LIQ 5 cm mass (fixed to chest wall) and small right axillary lymph node.

-Post-chemo thoracic CT scan: No mediastinal mass, no lung metastasis.

**Question:** Is palliative surgery recommended?

**Recommended Plan:** As local disease is not symptomatic now, surgery is not recommended; systemic therapy should be continued.
