Patient Presentation:

- A 75 year old male with past history of left breast cancer 12 years ago-which had underwent MRM followed by chemoRT and tamoxifen for two years-presented with a mass in lower part of sternum in epigastric region.

-Excisional biopsy was done and pathology examination reported metastatic carcinoma with breast origin. IHC was requested.

-Staging work up showed no distant metastasis.

-The patient had past history of prostatic cancer one year ago which had underwent radical prostatectomy.

Question: Is more surgical intervention is needed? What type of adjuvant treatment is recommended?

Recommended Plan: Regarding patient's gender, genetic consultation should be done; margin re-excision followed by RT and hormone therapy (Letrozole+diphereline /Tamoxifen) is recommended.
