**Patient Presentation:**

- A 30 year old female with breast mass from 2 years ago that is growing from breastfeeding period
- Sonography 1396: huge mass in UOQ and LOQ, semi-cystic, suspicious axillary lymphadenopathy
- MRI 1396: large heterogeneous 125 mm solid-cystic mass with mild persistent enhancement
- Pathology: lactating breast with inflammatory reaction and abscess formation, benign fibro-adenomatoid lesion with cellular stroma
- MRI 1397: large heterogeneous mass with heterogeneous enhancing, BIRADS 4
- Sonography 1398; multiple cystic lesion, solid heterogeneous mass 60\*80mm, reactive lymphadenopathy
- Mammography: multiple different size masses
- Core needle biopsy: fibro-epithelial lesion
- Axillary lymph node FNA: positive for malignancy
- Surgery: borderline Phyllodes tumor, one reactive lymph node

**Question:** What is the next plan?

**Recommended Plan:** Mastectomy, consider radiotherapy
