**Patient's Name:** R.V.

**Patient Presentation:**

-A 82 year old female with past history of left breast cancer 11 years ago which underwent MRM and chemoRT, presented with left arm cutaneous nodule 3 months ago. The patient had Left upper limb lymphedema.

-Cutaneous lesion was excised and pathology examination reported angiosarcoma, well differentiated, T=6.5cm, with free margins(nearest=8mm).

-Now she has presented with multiple(4-5) small purple nodules around the scar and in the left arm.

-Regarding patient's increased Cr level, Thoracic CT with IV contrast was not requested

**Question:** Plan: surgery, RT, or chemotherapy?

**Recommended Plan:** Chemotherapy is recommended.
