Patient Presentation:

-A 67 year old female, known case of right locally advanced breast cancer, received NAC and underwent MRM 9 months ago. She received adjuvant RT.

-Pathology report was as follows: IDC, G3, tumor residue 6mm, LN 9/9 involved, ER+.

-She presented with new supraclavicular LAP. FNA of lymph node was positive for malignancy.

-Her bone scan showed right Iliac lesion with increased uptake. In her abdominopelvic CT scan paraaortic LNs was reported. Her CEA is 23.

Question: Is she considered metastatic? What is the best locoregional treatment?

Recommended Plan: Abdominopelvic LNs don't have pathologic appearance. Systemic drug should be changed; then excision of LNs is justified.
