Patient presentation:

- 41years – positive family history (cousin)
- Presented with right breast mass. (1391) lumpectomy done.
- 1396 and two following years (1397-1398) again lumpectomy of the primary lesion and recurrences has been done and has received radiotherapy.
- The size of masses in these years sequentially were 14mm borderline phyllodes-4cm borderline phyllodes-11cm benign phyllodes.
- The last pathologic report was borderline phyllodes tumor and involved margins.
- Now it is recurred and patient's latest metastatic workup is normal.
- Patient has asked for bilateral prophylactic mastectomy

Question: What is the best plan of treatment for her?

If mastectomy is proposed, is reconstruction considered? should it be early or late?

Considered plan: surgery is recommended. It is no need for mastectomy. Mass excision regarding suitable margins is enough.





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
