Patient presentation:

- 39years – positive family history (her mother at 40 years)
- During routine screening following findings presented:
- Ultrasound: Left breast (2o'clock) 13*6mm well defined mass. BIRADS3.
- Mammography: Left breast upper central zone new asymmetry discovered. BIRADS 0.
- Core Needle Biopsy of the mass: ADH (Atypical ductal hyperplasia) versus Low grade DCIS
- Pathology Review: ADH
- Wire Excision: ADH, UDH (Usual ductal hyperplasia), Columnar Cell Changes, Apocrine Metaplasia
- Genetic test: Positive for TP53 & some VUS.

Question: Is there any need for Chemoprevention?

Recommendation: One more time of a reliable genetic test and analysis

Considered plan: Use of daily Tamoxifen for chemoprevention if she doesn't want the next sibling in her family planning.
