Mammography: BIRADS: 2, Asymmetry at 2 o'clock, near zone of left breast.

Sonography: cyst, duct ectasia.

MRI: Left UOQ Non Mass Enhancement 80*50*20 mm with extension to nipple,

BIRADS: 5.

Vacuum Assisted Biopsy (VAB): DCIS (reviewed), greatest dimension: 6mm, ER: 90% Pathology: No mass in the breast, 1/3 lymph nodes was involved with microinvasion.

Question:

What is the plan of axilla?

Recommended plan:

There is no need to axillary lymph node dissection, only adjuvant radiotherapy is enough.

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
