Patient's Name: J.A

Responsible Physician: Dr.Elahi

Patient presentation: A 52 year-old woman with positive family history and right breast mass in LOQ middle zone, 3*2 cm ill-defined mass and mild local skin edema after CNB.

Mammography: Right LOQ middle zone, density & segmental calcification

Sonography: Right 8 o'clock 20*13 mm spiculated mass, B4c, right axillary lymph node is suspicious

MRI: Right 7-8 o'clock, MZ 21*15 spiculated mass B6, 8-9 o'clock segmental non mass enhancement 70*30 mm touch to skin (skin tumoral involvement 4-8 o'clock?)

CNB: IDC, Grade: 2, ER: 80%, PR: 40%, HER-2: negative, Ki67: 15%.

Question:

Does she need neoadjuvant systemic therapy?

Does she have skin involvement?

Recommended plan:

- 1- Need to NCAT.
- 2- Marking the suspicious skin and resection at the surgery time.
